Group 1: Legislation and Programs Across the Country

Action: Thermostats

Group 3: State Collaboration and Consistency Among States

Action: Develop Consensus on Mercury products that are ripe for National Action so many states act concurrently

- Review Priority Issues with States
- Develop and Implement Action Plans for Targeted Sectors

Group 4: Information & Data Management

Action: National Hg Reduction Programs Database is well-populated, accessible & maintained.

How:

 Institutionalize gathering of program descriptions by emailing periodic reminders & making individual contacts to local programs

Who:

 NEWMOA (maintains as part of P2RX), EPA Regional P2 Coordinators (do outreach see "HOW")

Group 5: Enforcing Existing Regulations

Action: Commitment to enforce

How:

 Acquire additional funding focused on enforcement resources – via: fee-based, taxes, and/or shifting existing resources.

Who:

• States (ECOS?)

Group 6: Product Bans & Phase-outs

Action: Critical mass of states with switch and relay phase-out Legislation - tipping point

How:

- Provide Information resources to interested states
 - Legislation Primer/outreach & education
 - Basic toolbox network support
 - o Lowell report

Who:

• States that have passed legislation, and other parties working toward legislation

Group 7: Product Stewardship

Action: Phase out sales Hg thermostats and increase collection/recycling

How:

- Multi-state focus on big chain retailers and stakeholder dialogue
- Investigate manufacturer financed bounty
- Develop model legislation; Be persistent with legislative action sales bans
- Increase number of states in stakeholder dialogue

Who:

 Product Stewardship Institute and state and local members, manufacturers & retailers

Group 8: Relations with Manufacturers

Action: Commit to open communication between stakeholders to further mercury reduction efforts

How:

- Identify strategies to bring reluctant participants to the table
- Invite company representatives as well as trade association staff (or lobbyist)
- When you can, shop around for the right individuals to come, to make exchanges productive and valuable for all.
- Maximize opportunities for networking (realizing as much progress can happen there as in formal sessions)
- Broaden purposes of next conference. Include industry in planning for, and participating in.
- Address realistic and tangible issues
- Set up interim opportunities BEFORE the next conference
- Include Information in IMERC alert to open early dialogue with manufacturers

Group 9: Waste Management & Recycling

Action: Prevent Hg products and waste from going to landfills, incinerators & into wastewater

How:

- Model successful state/local programs that
 - Develop infrastructure
 - Education & outreach
 - o Funding/resources for monitoring/ enforcement
 - Remove exemptions

Who:

- Regulators (State &/or Federal) requiring action from:
 - o Dentists
 - Manufacturers
 - o Consumers
 - o Municipalities

Group 10: International Coordination

Action: Contribute to the development of active, effective UNEP Hg Partnerships to better characterize and reduce Hg uses, releases and exposure

How:

Organizations with Hg expertise commit resources to international efforts

Who:

 State and local governments EPA HQ/Regions (Fed Govt.) NGO's, Industry

Group 11: Stockpiling & Storage

Action: Identify & resolve the legal, financial & sighting requirements necessary for the long term safe and secure monitored storage of surplus Hg, taking into account the need for incentives for phase outs and retirement of Hg from the private sector, while recognizing the need to curtail or eliminate trade in Mercury

How:

- Form a workgroup to develop a broad consensus to build a national program for long term storage of Mercury stockpiles
- Build upon ECOS resolutions, DOD, EIS and QSC reports on storage

Who:

- Initial group of federal & state agencies
- Broader group: all relevant NGO's Fed agencies, states, recyclers, Int. organizations, industry (C.A.)
